- All members are entitled to stand for any elected post, but must be proposed and seconded before the AGM starts.
- Only paid up current members may vote at the AGM. The membership secretary will be taking payments before the meeting for the subscriptions, so you can pay before the AGM starts and be able to vote.
- The posts up for election for general committee are president, secretary, treasurer, drama coordinator, musical coordinator, technical manager, front of house manager, buildings manager, membership secretary, social secretary, stage director, marketing manager & four general committee members.


