Since the last newsletter we have had in "Loads of Money"! There is nearly £2,000.00 from "Godspell", nearly £1,000 from the bar as well as a £25.00 Premium Bond and the usual £550.00 from 12 Bath Road. Although Solent G&S were unable to put on their production, they have given us £350.00 in lieu of a cancellation fee.

I do not know, at the moment, what the final profit will be on "Godspell" as we still have to receive a bill for the Royalties, but at present it is £1,499.09, so I am fairly confident that we will make a profit.

We had a very successful AGM where every single one of the posts was filled, so that eases things considerably for those who had to do several jobs at once last year. We have some new faces on the Committee and we look forward to having "new blood" to bring in new ideas and ways to raise our profile and, of course, raise money.

You will be glad to know that the accounts have been audited and approved by our auditor.
