

The end of last month saw two very entertaining performances of *Charlie & the Chocolate Factory* by the Youth Theatre. Well done to everyone involved and it is great that the group will continue to meet during the autumn.

The Caucasian Chalk Circle is fast approaching which will be well worth seeing. The panto, Scrooge-The Panto is now cast and will shortly start rehearsals for the run in September. The readthrough and auditions for The Business of Murder are in early September so do come along and support Andy Kay who is producing the play.

During Cowes Week we hosted Anthony Adams and his Matt Monro & Frank Sinatra Tribute Show which was very well received. In October, we will again be hosting some events of the Isle of Wight Literary Festival.

The social programme is also underway for the year with a Quiz Night on October 12th. November 23rd sees the Christmas Fayre during the day and Honest Mike's Race Night in the evening. The Christmas Party will be on December 21st. Film@Trinity Theatre starts in September with a varied programme of films which will enrich the social scene and something new for CAODS.

Unfortunately our planning application had one objection to it which was from Cowes Town Council. Isle of Wight Council however gave a far more considered decision by approving our application to brick up the windows on the north side of the theatre. We are now in the process of meeting builders to agree costs and plan the project.

During a year the Theatre uses around 30,000 Kwh of electricity. In the last year this has cost almost £3,000. These are costs we would dearly like to reduce and recently we have negotiated a new supply contract for the coming year.

In addition, we need to avoid excess use of electricity. Recently there have been several instances of lights and equipment being left on when people leave the building. In light of this please adhere to the following rules.

- 1. If you turn it on, you are responsible for turning it off.
- 2. If you are the last person to leave the building, you must check that all lights are turned off.

If we all look out to not be wasteful with electricity it can only help with our level of running costs.



Synopsis: A critical and popular success in London, this psychological thriller about revenge centres on the interlocking triangular relationship between Dee, a successful television playwright; Hallett, a detective superintendent; and Stone, a humourless, prissy man. Dee arrives at Stone's flat, having accepted an invitation to discuss a script by Stone's wife. She is rather surprised when Hallett, with whom she is having an affair, also arrives, apparently to investigate a matter concerning Stone's son and his involvement with a drug ring. But where are wife and son? After many twists and turns, Stone's intentions become clear as he slowly reveals the precise nature of the trio's relationship: all three are very much concerned with the business of murder and the play culminates in another perpetration of the crime.


